
DOG OUTCOMES

1,600,000 have had a community outcome in 2024.* What kinds of dogs are in shelters? 18% from Adopt a Pet RETURNED TO FIELD/ OWNER **Puppies** Outcomes as % of community outcomes **AGES** Adults 89,000 fewer dogs (-6%) had a community live outcome compared to the same time period of 2023, and 144,000 fewer than in 2019 (-9%). In 2019, dogs accounted for 58% of all community live outcomes and now they only account for 52%. Additionally, 8% fewer dogs were returned to owners in 2024 2% XL (101+lbs) compared to 2023 (25,000), a 23% decrease from 2019 (84,000). 17% Small WAITING FOR OUTCOME 10% NON-LIVE **OUTCOMES** SIZES 14% 48% Medium TRANSFERRE OUT -1%










Length of Stay (<u>Median</u> Days) Before Adoption by Dog Size 50%

























Length of Stay (<u>Median Days</u>)



Kansas City Pet Project's Protocol

- At-Risk List: Dogs added for QOL concerns, harder placements, or length of stay 30+ days
- Weekly meetings with teams
- Weekly Capacity for Care Rounds with multiple teams
- . Keep a spreadsheet
- Highlight dogs who need attention
- All departments are accountable for working to outcome dogs

Williamson County's Protocol



- Daily Rounds, use of QR codes for concerns
- Weekly Meetings, use of spreadsheet to keep track of dogs' needs
- . Monthly Length of Stay Lists to highlight names for staff, volunteers, and visitors










Capacity Crisis Marketing works best when you have established yourself as a community member

BOGS Daily population movement



Animal Holds Meeting

Wednesdays - members from various departments discuss any holds on pets, which can include:

- · Animal Services holds
- Pending dangerous/potentially dangers dog declarations

Canine Operations Meeting

Wednesdays - members of canine operations team attend to discuss dogs currently on evaluate (due to behavior), dogs actively serving bite quarantine, and dogs on At-Risk list.

Capacity for Care Rounds

Thursdays – Members from various departments walk through and lay eyes on every dog kennel to determine pathway plans.





- Show volume of kennels, dramatic photos that appeal to people's emotions
- Video/walkthrough of the kennels to show the pets










Healthy competition!

Highlight the Urgency - Challenges











Pima Animal Care Center







- \$5/day for fosters who took large dogs (40lbs+)
 - No mandatory time frame
 - Offered crates if needed
- 158 large dogs went to foster during the 2 week push
- 103 NEW fosters were onboarded
- 50+ Day Trips and PJ parties meant lots more dogs getting a break from the noisy shelter!

Incentive Data HIGHLIGHTS



76%

Of fosters opted OUT of receiving the incentive, preferring it be donated back to the shelter



Urgent Placement dogs found placement within the 2 weeks



Dogs were adopted the same day of their return due to their good notes!



Of dogs were still out of the shelter 1 month after the incentive started.



Adoption numbers also saw around a 10-20% boost during the 2 weeks


Of participating animals are fully out of care. We only saw 43 animals back at the shelter for any reason in the 3 months after the incentive.

15 days

Average LOS of dogs returning from foster before adoption. Anecdotally, not seeing any correlation to previous LOS.

New fosters

Were TWICE as likely to adopt their foster than returning fosters. 23% of total fosters adopted their foster dog.
